

Editing Video Footage

Once you have the raw footage you can either edit it to make detailed video clips or post it on YouTube. The raw footage can be edited into video clips on your computer using the following standard software. If you have a MAC you will use IMOVIE if you have a PC then you will use WINDOWS MOVIE MAKER. Its important that content providers learn how to use the features available with IMOVIE or MOVIE MAKER. These features with the power of the Video Library enable content providers to create video content and to critique videos of live competition for athletes. In addition we recommend that you always save your raw video footage on a storage device. There are a number of storage devices that can be bought at most retail computer outlets.

When the video content is uploaded to Imovie/Movie Maker it will be listed as an Event. When the raw video footage is on a computer it can be edited into Slow Motion, Voice Over, Titles, Background Music and other variations. Once the video content has been edited it can be uploaded to YouTube and then linked with the Video Library. Your Next Steps using Imovie:

- Click on the Event that you would like to edit.
- Take your mouse and move the curser to the beginning area of that you would like to create and then click on that spot.
- A circle will appear using your mouse simple expand the area captured so that you have enclosed the content area of the video clip that you would want to create.
- Go to the Project Library at the top of your Imovie page and click on project library.
- In the project library in the bottom right hand corner click on the plus icon.
- On the page that appears type in the name of your new Video Clip.
- Click on your video clip in your event and drag it to the project library.
- Go to the menu bar and select share then click on youtube.
- Fill your youtube account name and click next.
- Your done.
